

Care Instructions



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The Basics:

Thank you for buying (or for considering buying) one of our products.

Please read these Care Instructions carefully. The 'Basics' apply to all collections. Beyond that, please refer to the specific 'Series' or 'Collection' guidelines below.

Natural Variation:

Most of our furniture is manufactured from natural materials which can display natural variations. Timber especially can display different grain patterns and will change colour and mellow over time, brass will tarnish, and fabrics can slightly discolour; - these are just characteristics of the natural beauty of the material but with proper maintenance they will age gracefully and last a lifetime. Separately, note that new furniture may vary in colour from items that have been previously purchased.

Environment:

Except where specified, our furniture is designed for indoor use with a relative humidity level between 25% and 60% and a temperature between 18 and 24 degrees Celsius (64 and 75 degrees Fahrenheit). When it leaves the workshop, the timber has been dried to a low level of humidity but wood is a living material and it will adapt to its surroundings. High humidity will cause wood to expand, whilst a low humidity environment, can cause slight warping or hairline cracks. If these things occur, it is a natural reaction of the timber to its environment and not a manufacturing defect. Keeping furniture away from air conditioning units and radiators will minimise the chances of the timber drying out, whilst keeping furniture out of direct sunlight will prevent fading.

Care for Oiled & Waxed Furniture:

In terms of everyday use, please remember that wood is a porous material so it will naturally absorb liquids and grease stains. This is minimised by finishing the timber with a layer of oil and wax, and by following these basic instructions.

Clean-up spillages and liquids from timber furniture as quickly as possible to prevent it from being absorbed into the wood. Oily stains are particularly hard to get out of the wood so take extra care with these. Wipe up any spillages with a clean dry cloth or paper towel.

For daily cleaning of your table use a damp cloth or sponge with clean water, wiping down the whole surface as one. Do not concentrate cleaning or wiping on small patches/areas of your tabletop, even if the mark/tarnish is located in one particular part of the surface. This will cause the surface to appear patchy due to uneven wiping and rubbing. Do not use spirits, bleaches or any other chemical cleaners to clean the timber. Please also ensure that direct contact with hot objects is avoided.

For long term general maintenance, periodic reapplication of wax is recommended once or twice a year (if in the meantime you feel the wood becoming drier apply sooner). This will, over time, make the surface more resistant to marks or staining.

Applying Wax to Non-Lacquered Furniture:

Your furniture arrives finished with a layer of oil & wax but we recommend you apply a fresh layer of wax (not oil*) before using your furniture. (* Please check Series-specific guidance below where exceptions apply, e.g. for items finished with Osmo).

To do this you will need natural wax and two soft white or undyed flannel cloths. We use Naturhaus Creme Wax which is included in our Care and Repair Kit. Take a small piece of the wax, the size relative to the surface being cleaned and rub it into one of the soft cloths. It is important to rub the wax thoroughly into the cloth so that it is one even thin layer, almost as if it has been absorbed by the cloth. Then use the cloth to rub the entire surface of the timber, always following the direction of the grain. Top up with wax if needed. Once the table has been waxed evenly all over, wipe the surface with the other clean white cloth to get rid of excess wax and to ensure a smooth application. Ensure the surface is dry to the touch before use. Ideally leave overnight.

Repairs to Oiled & Waxed Furniture:

One important benefit of an Oil & Wax finish is the relative ease with which damage can be repaired. For larger scratches and more stubborn marks gently sand the surface prior to applying the wax. To do this use a sandpaper sponge or fine-grit sandpaper followed by the sandpaper sponge. Always work in the direction of the grain. After sanding the surface make sure it's free from dust before applying the wax as directed above.

Maintenance & More:

Make sure to periodically check any fixings to ensure that none have come loose and to tighten where necessary, and never drag furniture when moving; always lift it.

Care & Repair Kit:

The Care & Repair Kit includes our recommended choice of wax, Naturhaus, along with one 100% Egyptian cotton white flannel, a Fine/ Medium sanding block, a Medium / Coarse Sanding Block, and a fine wool wire finishing pad. If your product requires repair or refurbishing, please contact us for instructions.

Brass Finishes

For regular maintenance of your brushed brass components, we recommend you buy an Ultra Fine Mirka Mirlon Finishing Pad from us or a specialist supplier, or some wire wool. If the brass tarnishes or dulls you can restore its (matte) finish by rubbing it with the Mirka pad or wire wool.

Oil & Wax Finish

Series Two has been finished with an application of Naturhaus clear natural oil (for Walnut) or Naturhaus white oil (for Ash), followed by an application of either Naturhaus clear natural (for Walnut) or Naturhaus white wax (for Ash). Please refer to the 'Basics' section about how to care for your natural Walnut or Ash Series One furniture. Make sure the correct wax is applied for either the Ash or Walnut.

Outdoor Osmo Natural Oil (Series Two)

Our Series Two outdoor products are finished with Osmo Natural Oil, Clear Matt 701. These can be cleaned daily with a damp cloth. For long-term general maintenance, periodic reapplication of the Oil is recommended so that over time the wood absorbs more and more oil making it increasingly repellent to marks and staining. Further information is available online.

Brass Finishes

For regular maintenance of your brushed brass components, we recommend you buy an Ultra Fine Mirka Mirlon Finishing Pad from us or a specialist supplier, or some wire wool. If the brass tarnishes or dulls you can restore its (matte) finish by rubbing it with the Mirka pad or wire wool.

Leather Finish

As a natural product, each and every hide is unique and will display traces of its past. For general care, please do not use chemicals, saddle soap, cleaning solvents, furniture polish, oils, vernish, abrasive cleaners, soap or ammonia water.

If the surface of your leather furniture is stained, blot excess liquid up as quickly as possible with a clean microfibre cloth. If necessary, use clean lukewarm water only and let dry naturally. If water is used, clean the entire area where spot occurred seat cushion. Please do not rub.

If the surface of your leather furniture has grease, wipe excess grease off the leather with a clean microfibre cloth. Then leave it alone as the spot should dissipate as much as possible into the leather in a short period of time. Please do not apply water or try to wash the grease spot.

If you want to give your furniture an extra layer of protection then we would recommend applying a coat of OSMO Polyx-Oil 3062 on delivery.

Lacquer (Colour) Finish

Outdoor OSMO Natural Wood Stain (Outdoor)

Our outdoor products are finished with Osmo Natural Oil Wood stain, Teak 708. These can be cleaned daily with a damp cloth. For long-term general maintenance, periodic reapplication of the Oil is recommended so that over time the wood absorbs more and more oil making it increasingly repellent to marks and staining.

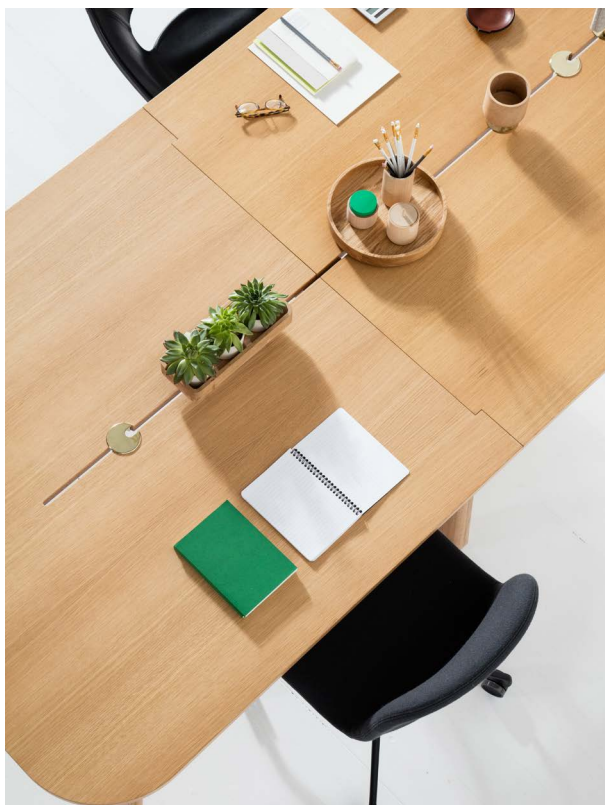

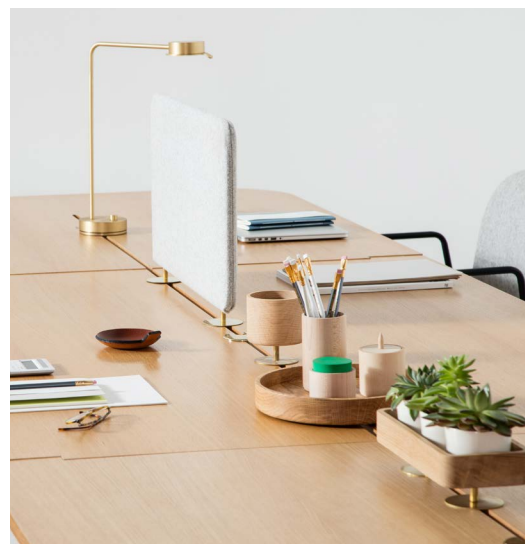

This finish is designed to maintain the 'raw' colour of the timber and forms a level of protection against liquid spills and everyday wear and tear. If you want to give your furniture an extra layer of protection then we would recommend applying a coat of OSMO Polyx-Oil 3062 on delivery.

Laminate (Fenix)

We use Fenix® branded laminate is an option for our Work Series. FENIX is an opaque and anti-fingerprint surface. No special maintenance is required: just a damp cloth with warm water or a mild detergent. Almost all regular household cleaning products or disinfectants can be safely used. 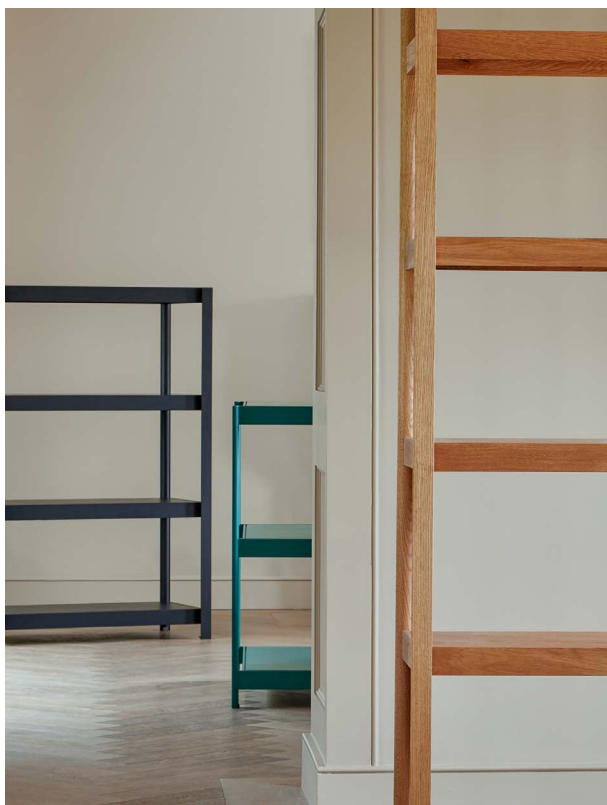

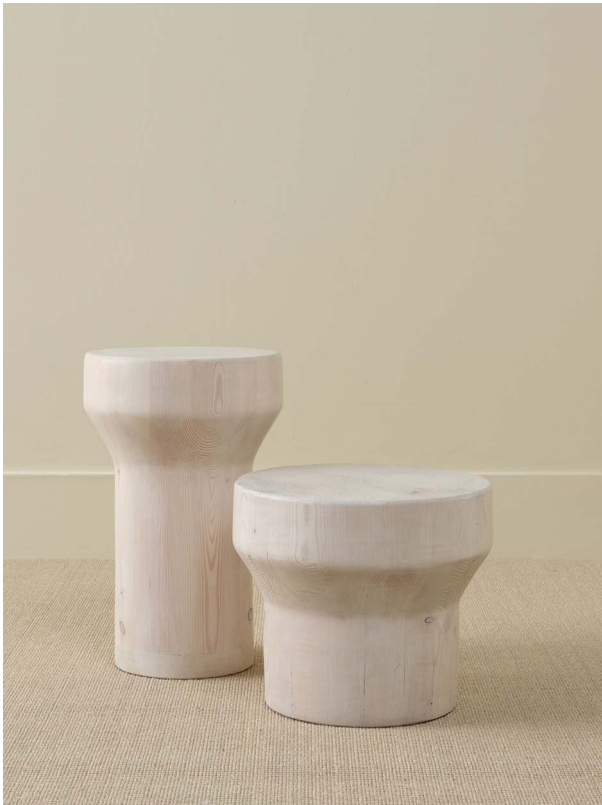

As a result, it's able to absorb moisture and oils, and go on to form a 'patina'. To ensure its long-lasting appeal, leather requires regular care and maintenance. Only use water based leather cleaners and conditioners.
